Lack of Annual Reporting to CPUC

GO 165, Section III-D, Reporting, states in part:

By July 1st each utility subject to this General Order shall submit an annual report for the previous year under penalty of perjury.

The report shall list four categorical types of inspections: Patrols, Overhead Detailed, Underground Detailed and Wood Pole Intrusive. The report shall denote the total units of work by inspection type for the reporting period and the number of outstanding (not completed) inspections within the same reporting period for each of the four categories.

The City of Biggs did not submit an annual report to the Commission for years 2012, 2013, and 2014.

Explanation of Violation(s):

Past-Due Pole Replacements

GO 165, Section III-C, - Record Keeping, states in part:

For all inspections records shall specify the circuit, area, facility or equipment inspected, the inspector, the date of the inspection, and any problems (or items requiring corrective action) identified during each inspection, as well as the scheduled date of corrective action.

GO 95, Rule 31.1, Design, Construction and Maintenance, states in part:

Electrical supply and communication systems shall be designed, constructed, and maintained for their intended use, regard being given to the conditions under which they are to be operated, to enable the furnishing of safe, proper, and adequate service.

The City of Biggs had 14 pole replacement work orders past their scheduled date of corrective action. These poles were tested unsatisfactory during an intrusive pole testing done in year 2010; they were scheduled for repair within 3 years from the date of inspection. These work orders were still open at the time of this audit.

The past-due pole replacements were on the following poles: Poles numbered 38, 83, 115, 227, 228, 235, 282, 283, 311, 314, 316, 320, 338, 391, and 395.

Exposed Ground Wire

GO 95, Rule 54.6-B, Ground Wires, states in part:

That portion of the ground wires attached on the face or back of wood crossarms or on the surface of wood poles and structures shall be covered by a suitable protective covering

The ground wire was partially exposed.

Explanation of Violation(s):

Impeded Climbing Space

GO 95, Rule 54.7-A1, Climbing and Working Space, states in part:

Climbing space shall be maintained from the ground level. Climbing space, measured from center line of pole, shall be provided on one side or in one quadrant of all poles or structures.....

A plastic tie wrapped around this pole obstructed climbing space.
