Abandoned Metal Object Adjacent to Structure

Substations shall be designed, constructed and maintained for their intended use, regard being given to the conditions under which they are to be operated, to promote the safety of workers and the public and enable adequacy of service.

An abandoned fan was found in the substation yard. We consider such a condition a tripping hazard.

Damaged Concrete Pad

GO 174, Rule 12, General, states in part:

The concrete pad supporting Regulator Bank 1 was damaged on one of its corners.

Uncovered Electrical Conduit

GO 174, Rule 12, General, states in part:

Substations shall be designed, constructed and maintained for their intended use, regard being given to the conditions under which they are to be operated, to promote the safety of workers and the public and enable adequacy of service.

An electrical conduit connected to a regulator was above grade across the yard. We consider such a condition a tripping hazard.

Outdoor Electrical Outlet Unprotected

GO 174, Rule 12, General, states in part:

Substations shall be designed, constructed and maintained for their intended use, regard being given to the conditions under which they are to be operated, to promote the safety of workers and the public and enable adequacy of service.

An electrical outlet on the outside of the storage building was not protected from water intrusion.

Explanation of Violation(s):

Malfunction Transformer Ventilation Fan

GO 174, Rule 30.1, states in part:

Each Operator shall establish, update as needed, and follow an Inspection Program.

TPUD's Substation Condition Assessment Checklist identifies non-working LTC fans as a condition to be documented during a monthly inspection.

Two out of three LTC fans were not working. This condition was not documented during TPUD's monthly inspection.
