BVE continues with "on the job training" as well as departmental cross training. BVE activated its EOC in June 2006 due to a valley wide power outage caused by equipment failure on SCE'S system. BVE implemented its Emergency Plan and utilized the Bear Valley Power Plant to restore power. Improvements and refinements were recognized during 'black starting' and disbursement of power from the BVPP.
