Mr. PROCOS,

At the recent EIR scoping meeting in San Luis Obispo I gave oral comment regarding the replacement of Steam Generators at Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant (DCNPP).

I strongly recommend that the scope of the EIR not limit itself to the steam generator replacement. Rather it must be much more comprehensive to include the replacement of all the aging components that must be replaced as well as the de facto high level nuclear waste dump that will be at DCNPP indefinitely.

I also recommend that the no project alternative include input regarding alternatives to DCNPP such as solar, wind, conservation, wave energy, fuel cells, natural gas and off-site improvements such as more efficient transmission lines and distributed energy and mini-turbines.

I understand that the PUC would like to build capacity in order to avoid any possible shortage in the future. I would like to challenge the energy supply infrastructure to meet that condition by an ambitious effort of building solar and wind energy facilities to offset the 2,220 MW of energy from DCIPP.

For starters lets build a 17 MW solar plant. That would be 100,000 sun tracking solar panels. Germany just ordered the world's largest solar facility, a 10MW facility. We should be the leaders.

Wind Harvest Inc. has a wonderful vertical shaft wind array that can be installed on rooftops throughout California. Offsetting DCIPP and including more capacity is a state wide endeavor.
