My husband and I purchased our home in the Highlands in 2001. We bought our home in the Highlands because we loved the natural view of the Crystal Springs reservoir and it's surroundings. We are shocked that the CPUC is seriously considering the PG&E project. The new lines would not be benefiting the San Mateo community they would run through. Our property value and our neighbors property values would be horrifically reduced by the destruction of our views. Not to mention the unknown potential health hazards of that kind of voltage running so closely to our homes. The homes running along highway 280 already have to contend with the freeway noise. Can you imagine the noise that months/years if construction would make? What about the noise of the proposed lines themselves and the below ground vibrations?
