

RE: Request for Position Statement from the NAHC for the Proposed SDG&E Mission – Miguel 230kV #2

Mr. Wood:

San Diego Gas and Electric Company is proposing to construct a new thirty-five mile long, 230-kilovolt (kV) circuit from its existing Mission Substation to its existing Miguel Substation. Attached Figure 1-1, Project Overview Map provides a general project location.

The proposed project has three primary components; 1.) constructing a new 230kV transmission circuit, 2.) relocating existing 69kV and 138kV circuits, and 3.) modifying SDG&E's existing Mission and Miguel Substations.

The new 230kV transmission circuit would be added to modified existing double circuit 138kV steel lattice tower structures currently supporting 69kV and 138kV circuits from Miguel Substation to Fanita Junction, and within a vacant position on existing double circuit 138kV structures, all within in the existing SDG&E right-of-way from Miguel Substation to Fanita Junction to Mission Substation. The new 230kV circuit, rated at approximately 1,000 megawatts (MW), would provide a second 230 kV circuit between SDG&E's Miguel and Mission Substations. A total of approximately six new steel poles would be installed to route the new 230kV circuit into the Miguel and Mission substation for interconnection and past Los Coches Substation. Finally, approximately ten steel poles would replace selected steel lattice towers where necessary for adequate structural support. No new right of way would be required for any new or replacement structures.

The existing 69kV and 138kV transmission circuits currently attached to the existing 138kV steel lattice tower structures would be relocated onto a new pole line within the existing SDG&E right-of-way to provide a position for the new 230kV circuit. Construction of the relocated 69kV/138kV circuits would utilize both wood and steel double circuit pole structures and would run parallel to the new 230kV transmission circuit for approximately 24 miles within the existing SDG&E right-of-way from Miguel Substation to Los Coches Substation and from Los Coches Substation to Fanita Junction.

SDG&E's existing Miguel Substation and Mission Substation would be modified to accommodate the new 230kV transmission circuit. New 230kV circuit breakers would be added with associated disconnects, steel, and protection. All proposed substation modifications would occur on existing utility-owned property and within the existing substation developed areas.

The Miguel-Mission 230kV #2 Project (project) is proposed to reduce constraints on SDG&E's existing electrical system that would occur upon interconnection of merchant generators now under construction or proposed for construction south and east of SDG&E's Miguel Substation. Removing such constraints to the interconnection of merchant generation provides SDG&E and California Independent System Operator (CAISO) customers with additional access to a robust energy market through increased access to remote sources of generation. The additional generation would increase competition for the benefit of customers, thereby reducing energy costs. As described below, SDG&E has identified this project as having significant economic benefits to SDG&E and CAISO customers consistent with the objectives of Assembly Bill 970 (AB 970) to remove electric transmission constraints. Access to new generation is needed to meet statewide capacity requirements and to help prevent future electric energy resource deficiencies, load curtailments, and energy price spikes.

SDG&E is requesting information on traditional cultural properties and/or Native American sacred lands that may be associated with the general project location as indicated on attached Figure 1-1. Our request is made pursuant to provisions of the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) General Order No. 131-D, Appendix A, Section IX, B.1.d. Per the General Order, this request to the NAHC constitutes notice of the proposed project to California Indian Reservation Tribal Governments in the general project area. Please provide us with a written response to this request at your earliest convenience.
