RE: Northeast San Jose Transmission Reinforcement Project

Dear Ms. Ikle:

The board of directors of Bayside Technology Park in Fremont, California, has received information regarding a proposal by the California Public Utilities Commission to install a transmission line, named the Northeast San Jose Transmission Reinforcement Project.

Bayside Technology Park is situated along the 880 Freeway corridor. As such, they are strongly opposed to the installation of a transmission line along the eastern edge of 880, as stated in the Executive Summary as "I-880-B Alternative".

The owners, however, have expressed their strong support of the proposal identified in the Executive Summary as "Westerly Route Alternative". As stated in the summary, "This route would avoid nearly all developed areas by following PG&E Co.'s existing transmission corridor through parts of the Don Edwards San Francisco Bay National Wildlife Refuge and other open spaces." This location is the most logical and less intrusive one of any of the alternatives listed.

We appreciate your consideration of the concerns of the owners of Bayside Technology Park.
