I am concerned about the fact that Carmel Country Highlands has been ~~mis-~~ mis-mapped on all of the project maps that I have seen. The project maps have it placed north of the 56 freeway when in fact, it is directly adjacent to the proposed route of the Sunrise Powerlink along the Los Penasquitos Preserve between milepost 148 and 149.5. Given that there were no visual points of interests noted, <sup>(take the over look park at Carmel Mountain & Carmel Country rd)</sup> no traffic evaluation mentioning Carmel Mountain road in this area and no mention made of Sage Canyon Community Park and school (both of which are within 2000 ft of the line), I am concerned that many of these features in Carmel Country Highlands were not adequately noted or evaluated due to this mapping error.

Was the Carmel Valley Community Plan viewed for conformance?

Will there be road closures on Carmel Mountain Road? None are mentioned but I can't see how else they will access the Power Pole in this area as we are not connected by roads to Park Village to the East

Another point of concern is the significant and unmitigable wildfire risk posed by this line in our community. There was the assumption made that wildfires that start in this area have the potential to be quickly contained due to fire resource availability and rapid response times, when in fact, representatives from the fire department have confirmed that Carmel Country Highlands as well as Torrey Hills (to the west) and Del Mar Mesa (to the East) are "underserved" areas of the city with regard to fire resources. Yet we sit on one of the largest ~~wood~~ fire loads with the Los Penasquitos preserve which has not burned in ~~over~~ recent wildfires.
