**Southern California Edison Company's (U 338-E) Low Income Assistance Programs Monthly Report
May 2007**

Introduction

Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby submits its Low Income Assistance Programs Monthly Report for May 2007.¹ This monthly report includes a brief narrative and quantitative tables (attached hereto), which describe the results of program activity during the month of May 2007 for SCE's low income assistance programs – the Low Income Energy Efficiency (LIEE) program and the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) program.

In D.06-12-038, the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) approved the format of the accompanying tables, which were developed by consensus among the joint utilities (SCE, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) and San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E)), the Energy Division, and the Division of Ratepayer Advocates.

Minor changes have been made to the tables to incorporate input received at the February 21, 2007 workshop on low income reporting conducted by the Energy Division. Additionally, the joint utilities and the Energy Division held a conference call on April 27, 2007 to discuss additional information that the Energy Division requested during the February 21 workshop. The joint utilities are now reporting this information in newly added tables 5L and 6C.

All results reported in this monthly report update and supersede data provided in previous reports.

California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) Program

As of May 31, 2007, a total of 1,026,320 customers were participating in the CARE program. Based on SCE's revised estimates of CARE-eligible customers and the increased income eligibility to 200% of federal poverty guidelines, SCE's current enrollment equates to a penetration rate of approximately 76%.

Outreach efforts and communications to SCE's in-language customers and under-penetrated areas continue to be a priority. In May 2007, SCE partnered with the Equal Opportunity and Public Affairs Departments in CARE outreach activities that targeted SCE's hard-to-reach customer base. These efforts included an event held at the San Bernardino County Fair on May 11, 2007. SCE had its Mobile Education Unit (MEU) on hand to allow customers to see examples of energy efficient appliances. In addition, customers were provided information on the CARE/FERA program and were assisted with completing a CARE/FERA application. In addition, a CARE/FERA outreach was

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held at St. Emydius church where bilingual volunteers were on hand to provide assistance with enrollment in the CARE/FERA programs.

SCE continues to include a CARE enrollment application in the Welcome Kit that is sent to residents requesting new service or transfers of service. In 2007, as of May 31, more than 10,900 customers were enrolled in CARE as a result of this Welcome Kit.

In April, SCE completed a new CARE Program video. Each video includes the information in English, Spanish, Korean, Chinese (Mandarin), Cambodian and Vietnamese, and will be distributed to the Public Affairs, Consumer Affairs and Equal Opportunity departments who have direct customer contact and can share the information with customers at outreach events to encourage enrollments.

In late-April, SCE developed and sent approximately 229,000 bilingual direct mail letters, which included a CARE enrollment application, to targeted customers currently not on the CARE rate. Through May 31, 2007, SCE has received 3,957 enrollment applications resulting in 3,166 new enrollments and 392 recertifications.

Finally, SCE, as well as PG&E, SDG&E, and SoCalGas, are working with the Energy Division to assist the Commission in its efforts to comply with SB 580. Through this SB 580 pilot program, the joint utilities will facilitate the enrollment of Women, Infants, Children (WIC) participants onto the CARE rate. This CPUC-established pilot project is tentatively scheduled to be implemented on July 1, 2007.

Low Income Energy Efficiency (LIEE) Program

SCE continues to strengthen delivery of comprehensive services to its low income customers. SCE contracts directly with an experienced and informed network of providers, including Community Based Organizations (CBOs) and private contractors. SCE also continues to implement LIEE as a leveraging vehicle with CBOs who deliver similar services through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) administered by the California State Department of Community Services. For instance, SCE provides LIHEAP agencies with refrigerators, at no cost, for installation into a joint LIEE/LIHEAP home. This leveraging approach maximizes the budgets of both the LIEE and LIHEAP programs in order effectively to serve as many customers as possible.

SCE also continues to competitively bid the purchase of energy-efficient appliances. By purchasing appliances in bulk, SCE is able to obtain low prices on equipment and exercise a level of control over inventory that may not otherwise be possible.

Beginning in late-March and continuing through mid-April, SCE encouraged customers currently enrolled in CARE to take advantage of the LIEE (Energy Management Assistance (EMA)) program through a targeted direct mail offer. This bilingual mailer included a personalized fact sheet with details about the EMA program. Results show an increase of calls regarding interest in the LIEE program.
