O P I N I O N

John H. Scarborough, applicant herein, asks authority to discontinue domestic and irrigation water service to approximately twenty consumers located on the La Fresa Home Tract, Los Angeles County, California.

Public hearings were held at Los Angeles before Examiner Williams on November 25th and December 4th, 1922, and January 4th, 1923, of which hearings applicant's consumers were notified and given an opportunity to appear and be heard.

Mr. Scarborough's testimony at the first hearing indicated that he was willing to continue the service of water to his consumers provided he could find some way to finance the necessary repairs to the pipe line and pumping equipment.

Prior to the last hearing in this matter Mr. Scarborough succeeded in financing the required repairs to his system and therefore formally requested the dismissal of the application.

O R D E R

Applicant herein having appeared and made formal request
that the above entitled proceeding be dismissed.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that said proceeding be and it is here-
by dismissed.
