Patterson, Secretary, of said The Upper Lake Farmers' Telephone Association and other members of said Association having testified in reference to the controversy arising as to the legality of said purported annual meeting; and this Commission having fully considered all the evidence and the record herein and being fully advised in the premises, and good cause appearing therefor,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be, and the same is hereby, dismissed without prejudice.
