ORDER

J. R. Tedrick applies to the Railroad Commission for permission to cease operation and abandon stage line operated by him between Whittier and the Standard Oil Company's wells at Coyote Oil Wells.

The operative right herein proposed to be abandoned was obtained by applicant under Decision No. 6153 in Application No. 4376, dated February 25, 1919. Applicant states in support of his petition that during the time the wells of the Standard Oil Company were in operation there were some 70 regular passengers to be transported between the points served by him, but that due to the fact that the oil company has discontinued development work in this territory, the regular passengers have been so far reduced that operation cannot be further carried on except at a considerable loss.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be, and the same hereby is granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. That ten (10) days after receipt of the Order herein, applicant shall have filed with the Railroad Commission, cancellation of tariffs and time schedules covering service herein authorized to be abandoned.
