FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Whereas the Railroad Commission in its Decision No. 10520, dated May 31st, 1922, ordered that Mrs. G. Guerra, operating under the name and title of Cambria Telephone Company, was thereby authorized to place in effect certain schedule of rates, providing, that authority granted therein should not become effective until petitioner submitted to the Commission satisfactory evidence that the lines and instruments of the then present system have been so rebuilt or repaired that efficient and satisfactory telephone service is being provided, nor until this Commission issued its supplemental order herein setting forth that such repairs or replacements have been completed, and

Whereas the Railroad Commission in its Decision No. 11397, dated December 23, 1922, authorized the sale and transfer of the properties of the Cambria Telephone Company to J. R. Fort, and authorizing J. R. Fort to purchase and acquire the same, providing, that J. R. Fort comply with the conditions of

the Order in Decision No. 10520, dated May 31st, 1922, and

Whereas the Railroad Commission has evidence to the effect that J. R. Fort has complied with the conditions of the Order in Decision No. 10520, dated May 31st, 1922,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that J. R. Fort be, and he is, hereby granted authority to charge and collect the schedule of rates as set forth in the Order of this Commission's Decision No. 10520, for service rendered on and after June 1, 1923, providing, that this schedule of rates is filed with the Railroad Commission on or before May 20th, 1923.
