ORDER OF DISMISSAL

The City of Sacramento, having complained to this Commission regarding the rates and charges for street lighting service furnished by Pacific Gas and Electric Company, and having asked that this Commission fix a just and reasonable rate for such service, and that Pacific Gas and Electric Company be required to make due reparation for the amount which it has collected in excess of a reasonable rate, and the Railroad Commission, having by Decision No. 11457, dated December 30, 1922, fixed just and reasonable rates to be charged by Pacific Gas and Electric Company for street lighting service through its entire territory, and the Railroad Commission being now advised that the City of Sacramento does not desire to continue the matter further,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this complaint be, and the same is hereby dismissed without prejudice.
