O R D E R

In this proceeding B. L. Halverson, doing business  
under the fictitious name of Modesto-La Grange Stage, has filed  
an application with the Railroad Commission in which he petitions  
for an order authorizing him to discontinue automotive stage  
service between La Grange and Don Pedro Dam and through service  
between Modesto and Don Pedro Dam; and for further order cancel-  
ing and annulling the certificate now held by him authorizing  
such service.

Under Decision No. 8707 in Application No. 6469, dated  
March 4, 1921, applicant herein was granted a certificate of  
public convenience and necessity authorizing the operation of  
automotive passenger stage service between La Grange and Don  
Pedro Bar. This certificate was granted upon a showing that  
a considerable passenger traffic had developed between the two  
points in question due to construction by the Modesto-Turlock  
Irrigation District of a large dam at Don Pedro. This work  
has now been completed and there is no further necessity for

the operation of service as authorized under said certificate. Accordingly, we are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the above entitled application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate granted to B. L. Halverson under Decision No. 8707 in Application Number 6469 be, and the same hereby is revoked and annulled and said B. L. Halverson be, and he hereby is authorized to discontinue service between La Grange and Don Pedro Damsite.
