SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Under date of May 24, 1922, the Railroad Commission issued its Decision No. 10500 in which decision Trueman E. Rigney was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the operation of an automotive stage line as a common carrier of passengers between San Andreas, Angels Camp, Valley Springs and Sheep Ranch and intermediate points, California.

Condition No. 2^o of said order provided that service could not be discontinued without written consent of the Railroad Commission. It now appears that upon the loss of his contract for the transportation of U. S. Mail, said Rigney did abandon and thereafter discontinue to operate automotive stage service as a common carrier of passengers under the certificate held by him authorizing the service between the points hereinabove named, and
