ORDER

In this proceeding Frederick Ernsting petitions the Bailroad Commission for an order authorizing him to file tariff of rates, time schedules and rules and regulations covering the operation of automotive stage service as a common carrier of passengers between Imperial, El Contro and Calexico, and intermediate points in California. Applicant claims the right to operate between the above mentioned termini under the provisions of Section 5, Chapter 213, Statutes of 1917.

This claimed right has been fully adjudicated by the Railroad Commission in Decision No. 12166 in Case No. 1902, dated June 1, 1923, being an investigation on the Commission's own initiative into the methods, practices and operations of O. D. Hadley and others. The above numbered decision has recently been confirmed by the state Supreme Court (S.F.10794) and it is accordingly unnecessary to review the evidence in detail in this preceeding.

In view of the findings and order of the Railroad Commission in Case No. 1902, above referred to, the present application must be denied.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be, and the same hereby is, denied.
