SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

LAKE TAHOE RAILWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMPANY having asked permission to issue one day six per cent notes in the principal sum of \$50,000.00 for the purpose of renewing the \$50,000.00 of notes issued pursuant to the authority granted by this Commission in Decision Number 6876, dated November 28, 1919, a public hearing having been held before Examiner Fankhauser and it appearing that said notes will not constitute a lien on any of the corporation's properties, that the payment of the notes will be secured by a guarantee signed by all the stockholders of Lake Tahoe Railway and Transportation Company or by said stockholders endorsing said notes and that the money, property or labor to be procured or paid for by the issue of the \$50,000.00 of notes is reasonably required by applicant, and the Railroad Commission being of the opinion that the request of applicant should be granted, now therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that LAKE TAHOE RAILWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMPANY be, and it is hereby, authorized to issue on or before March 1, 1924, to Union Trust Company of San Francisco, its one day six per cent notes in the aggregate sum of \$50,000.00 for the purpose

of refunding the notes referred to in the supplemental petition
in the above entitled application filed on November 19, 1923, pro-
vided said notes are issued so as to net applicant not less than
the face value thereof, and provided further that Lake Tahoe Railway
and Transportation Company keep such record of the issue and sale
of the notes herein authorized and of the disposition of the proceeds
as will enable it to file on or before the 25th day of each month
a verified report as required by the Railroad Commission's General
Order Number 24, which order so far as applicable is made a part of
this order.
