## ORDER

Pacific Electric Railway Company, a corporation, has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of a shelter station heretofore maintained at Bolsa Chica on its Newport Line.

Applicant alleges that the shelter station was originally erected and has since been maintained principally for the accommodation of the members and employees of the Bolsa Gun Club; that the shelter station proposed to be abandoned is now old and dilapidated and is but little used; and that the public convenience and necessity do not require its rehabilitation and future maintenance.

An investigation has been made by the Service Department of the Commission from which it appears that there is no right of way deed or agreement requiring the maintenance of the shelter station and that the condition of the station has been the subject of complaint to the applicant by the Bolsa Land Company, the grantee of the right of way upon which the station shelter is

located, as to its being considered a nuisance due to improper use by the public, and suggesting its removal.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be, and the same hereby is granted.
