SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Under Decision No. 9079, dated June 9, 1921, in the above entitled proceeding Anna E. Vaughan, J. R. Thompson and E. Warner, co-partners, were granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the operation of an automotive stage line between Napa and Napa Soda Springs.

Under date of January 4, 1924, a signed statement was filed by the co-partnership mentioned above in which they stated that this stage service was operated during the year 1923 at a considerable loss due to the fact that over 75% of the travel to the Springs was by private automobile; further, that the hotel company operating the resort at Napa Soda Springs had informed them that during the year 1924 they would operate a hotel bus to care for guests not having their own machines for transportation. They, accordingly, request that the certificate be revoked and they be permitted to discontinue service, and
