BY THE COMMISSION,

ORDER

J. K. Vanderhurst and E. K. Duda, co-partners, have filed an application with the Railroad Commission in which they petition for a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the operation of automotive stage service for the transportation of passengers, baggage and express between Salinas and Tassajara Hot Springs serving the intermediate point of Jamesburg.

Applicants propose to use two Packard cars, one of 8 and the other of 11 passenger capacity and to operate one round trip each day, except Sunday, during the open season for the resort, which is approximately from May 1st to October 15th of each year. Rates to be charged are as specifically set forth in Exhibit "A" attached to the application herein.

Applicants give as their reason for the establishment of service as herein proposed, the fact that they are now

engaged in carrying the mail between Salinas and the Springs; that there is no service by public carrier operating over this route and that public necessity requires the establishment of service as herein proposed.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA
HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by J. K. Vanderhurst and E. K. Duda, co-partners, of an automotive stage line as a common carrier of passengers, baggage and express between Salinas and Tassajara Hot Springs during the summer season of each year when the Springs are open, and

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity be, and the same hereby is granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. Applicants shall file their written acceptance of the certificate herein granted within a period of not to exceed ten (10) days from date hereof; and shall file, in duplicate, within a period of twenty (20) days from date hereof, tariff of rates and time schedules identical with those as filed as Exhibits "A" and "B" attached to the application herein.

2. The rights and privileges herein granted shall not be discontinued, sold, leased, transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such discontinuance, sale, lease, transfer or assignment has first been secured.

3. No vehicle may be operated by applicants herein unless such vehicle is owned by said applicants or is leased under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
