IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Earl B. Stephens be and he is hereby authorized to dispose of and sell that certain telephone line and system described in this application to Mr.Frank A. Grenitta for the sum of Eighty (80) Dollars, and that Mr. Frank A. Grenitta be authorized to operate said telephone line as a farmer line connecting with The Pacific Telephone and

Telegraph Company's exchange at Angels Camp and to suspend operations as a public utility from and after April 1, 1924, provided

(1) that the authority herein granted shall apply only to such transfer as shall have been completed on or before April 30, 1924, and

(2) that certified copies of instruments of conveyance shall be filed with this Commission by Earl B. Stephens within thirty (30) days from the date on which they are actually executed.
