SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Railroad Commission having on April 15, 1924,  
made its Decision No. 13409 authorizing, among other things, the  
exercise by Southern California Edison Company of certain franchise  
rights and privileges in a portion of Kings County, and as the re-  
sult of a typographical error the word "west" having been used  
in said Decision where the word "east" was intended,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the last paragraph of the  
Order in said Decision No. 13409 be and it is amended to read  
as follows:

" THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES THAT public  
convenience and necessity require the exercise by San  
Joaquin Light and Power Corporation of the franchise  
rights and privileges granted by Ordinance No. 25 of

Kings County, limited, however, to the area lying outside and generally west of the boundary line described in applicant's Revised Exhibit No. 4 in this matter, and the exercise by Southern California Edison Company of the franchise rights and privileges granted by Ordinance No. 104 of Kings County, limited, however, to the area lying within and generally east of the boundary line described in applicants' Revised Exhibit No. 4 in this matter."
