FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

ORIGINAL

The Order in Decision Number 11542 dated January 23, 1923 in the above entitled matter reads in part as follows:-

"The Commission hereby declares that hereafter upon the filing of a certified copy of the ordinance granted to applicant by the Town of Willits, a certified copy of the ordinance granted to applicant by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Mendocino, and upon the filing of the stipulation referred to in the foregoing opinion, the Commission will declare that public convenience and necessity require and will require the exercise by applicant of the rights and privileges granted by such ordinances, subject to such terms and conditions as the Railroad Commission may prescribe."

On May 5, 1924 Central Mendocino County Power Company filed with the Commission a certified copy of a franchise, (Ordinance No. 215) adopted March 11, 1924 by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Mendocino and a certified copy of a franchise (Ordinance No. 1 since 1924) granted March 3, 1924 by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Willits, together with a stipulation duly executed in which it agrees never to claim a value for such franchises in excess of the amounts actually paid therefor, which amounts are reported at \$350.00, therefore

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require, and will require, the exercise by the Central Mendocino County Power Company of the rights and privileges conferred by the ordinance of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Mendocino, adopted March 11, 1924, and by the ordinance of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Willits, adopted March 3, 1924; such rights and privileges may be exercised only to the extent that it is necessary to construct, maintain and operate an electrical transmission and distribution system, and a water collection, transmission and distribution system in the territory commonly known as the Little Lake Valley, and lying in Townships 17, 18, North, in Ranges 13 and 14, West, Mendocino County; and to construct, maintain and operate an electrical transmission line from said territory to the Snow Mountain Water and Power Company's plant in Potter Valley.
