PRELIMINARY ORDER

WHEREAS, an application has been filed on behalf of  
the applicant hereinabove named for permission to operate  
motor truck transportation service as a common carrier of  
property for compensation between Los Angeles and East San  
Pedro-Terminal Island and between East San Pedro-Terminal  
Island and San Pedro and Wilmington, and

WHEREAS, at the present time it appears that the  
said applicant has heretofore been operating over said  
route without first obtaining a certificate of public con-  
venience and necessity as required under the provisions of  
Section 5 of Chapter 213, Statutes of 1917, and amendments  
thereto, and

WHEREAS, it further appears that such operation has been conducted by said applicant in ignorance of the provisions of said Act and not with any deliberate intention of violating statutory provisions or rules and regulations of this Commission,

NOW THEREFORE, Good cause appearing,

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by E. H. Thomas and C. A. Thomas, partners, doing business under the fictitious name of Thomas & Son Transfer Company pending final determination of his application as hereinabove numbered, and

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a temporary certificate of public convenience and necessity in accordance with the above declaration be, and the same hereby is granted, subject to the following conditions:

That service shall be rendered by said applicant under his rates as now charged by him for such service; and that service under the above temporary certificate shall cease within a period of ten (10) days from date of the Commission's decision upon his application as hereinabove numbered unless said decision grants to said applicant, a permanent certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing a continuation of such service.
