ORDER DENYING REHEARING

On July 1, 1924, the Railroad Commission issued its
Decision No. 13762 under which decision Willard W. Cousins,
as executor of the Estate of H. H. Cousins, deceased, doing
business under the fictitious name of Cousins Launch & Lighter
Company was granted a certificate of public convenience and
necessity authorizing the operation of vessels for the transportation of persons and property upon the inland waters of
the State of California, namely, Humboldt Bay.

On July 11, 1924, applicant filed a petition for rehearing said petition setting forth as reasons for reconsideration of the previous order of the Commission the allegation that applicant failed to ask for all that it desired in its original application and that its representative at the previous hearing was not fully familiar with the operations of the applicant.

Notice of hearing upon the above application was forwarded to and received by applicant. He, however, failed to appear but sent a representative in his behalf to present applicant's case. The order of the Commission granted to applicant exactly what
