SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Under Decision No. 13368, dated April 2, 1924, in the above entitled application James Vinten and Ruby Vinten doing business under the fictitious name of The Terminal Island Transportation Company were granted a cortificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the operation of automotive stage service between Ferry Landing, (East San Pedro) and Anaheim Street and Canal Street (Wilmington).

Subsequent to the inauguration of said service applicants requested permission to discontinue the same for an indefinite period stating in support of such petition that the service could not be rendered except at a considerable loss. Discontinuance of service with permission to still hold the right to operate was refused by the Com-

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mission, whereupon applicants requested that the certificate be revoked and annulled, and

Good cause appearing,

IT IS EEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 13368 as regards Application No. 9789 granting to James Vinten and Ruby Vinten a certificate to operate automotive stage service as hereinabove described be, and the same hereby is revoked and annulled.
