FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

This Commission by Decision No. 13306, dated March 22, 1924, having authorized the transfer of a certain public utility water plant supplying consumers at Buena Park, Orange County, from A. L. Bennett to George O. Trapp, Jack Golden and William Schumacher, and the said decision having stated that "authority to abandon water service may be granted by the issuance of a supplemental order when the Commission has received satisfactory assurance that the municipal water system of the Town of Buena Park is installed and water service is available to the consumers"; and a certified statement having been filed with the Commission by Orange County Water Works District No. 2 to the effect that all consumers who have in the past been served by the water plant owned by George O. Trapp, Jack Golden and William Schumacher are now connected with the said Orange County Water Works District No. 2 or have filed application for service with the said district and can be connected

to its pipe lines at any time; and it appearing that authority to discontinue service by the said George O. Trapp, Jack Golden and William Schumacher should now be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that George O. Trapp, Jack Golden and William Schumacher be and the same are hereby authorized to discontinue service to consumers at Buena Park, Orange County, on and after November 1, 1924, and thereafter be relieved of all public utility obligations in connection with such water service.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that George O. Trapp, Jack Golden and William Schumacher be and the same are hereby directed to notify all consumers in writing, within ten (10) days of the date of this order, of their intention to discontinue water service on November 1, 1924, and to furnish to this Commission, within fifteen (15) days of the date of this order, a certified statement that all consumers have been notified of such intention to discontinue service.

The effective date of this order is hereby fixed as November 1, 1924.
