FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Railroad Commission by Decision Number 14176 dated October 16, 1924 authorized the Central Counties Gas Company to issue and sell \$80,000.00 of five year seven percent. convertible bonds subject among others to the condition that the authority to issue such bonds will not become effective until the Commission has authorized the company to execute a trust indenture under which the convertible bonds will be issued. The Commission in its decision took exception to certain provisions of the trust indenture filed on October 10, 1924. Since then the company has filed with the Commission a trust indenture eliminating all of the provisions to which the Commission took exception in its decision. The trust indenture filed with the Commission on October 25th is in satisfactory form, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Central Counties Gas Company be, and it is hereby, authorized to execute a trust indenture substantially in the same form as the trust indenture filed with the Commission on October 25th provided, that the authority herein granted to execute such trust indenture is for the purpose of this proceeding only, and is granted in so far as this Commission has jurisdiction

under the terms of the Public Utilities Act, and is not intended as an approval of said trust indenture as to such other legal requirements to which said trust indenture may be subject.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the order in Decision Number 14176 dated October 16, 1924 shall remain in full force and effect, except as modified by this First Supplemental Order.
