ORDER OF DISMISSAL

A. Nelson, a warehouseman engaged in the business of cleaning and storing beans in Buena Park, Orange County, having applied to the Railroad Commission for permission to issue a promissory note in the face amount of \$2,900.00, secured by a mortgage on his private property and a chattel mortgage on his warehouse properties, to renew indebtedness of like amount, a public hearing having been held before Examiner Williams, and the Commission having been advised subsequent to the hearing that applicant has paid in cash the sum of \$1,000.00 on account of the indebtedness and that he does not at this time intend to place a mortgage on his public utility properties, and it appearing that the \$1,900.00 remaining outstanding is evidenced by a note secured by a mortgage on, and representing money borrowed for, his private property, and the Commission being of the opinion that it is not necessary for it to authorize the issue of the note

for \$1,900.00 or the execution of the mortgage on the non-public properties.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled matter be, and it is hereby, dismissed.
