O R D E R

Robert Gallegos, owner of the Juan Gallegos Water Works, which supplies domestic water to approximately thirty consumers in and in the vicinity of Mission San Jose, Alameda County, having made application for authority to transfer the property to Telles Brothers Water Company, a public utility now engaged in supplying water for domestic purposes in adjacent territory, and which joins in the application, and it appearing that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Robert Gallegos be and he is hereby authorized to sell to Telles Brothers Water Company all that certain property more particularly described in the application herein, subject to the following conditions:

1. The authority herein granted shall apply only to such transfer as shall have been made on or before May 1, 1925, and a certified copy of the instrument of conveyance shall be filed with this Commission by said Robert Gallegos within thirty (30) days from the date on which it is executed.
2. Within ten (10) days from the date on which Robert Gallegos actually relinquishes control and possession of the

property herein authorized to be sold, he shall file with this Commission a certified statement indicating the date upon which such control and possession was relinquished.

3. The consideration given for the transfer of this property shall not be urged before this Commission or any other public body as a finding of value of the property for rate fixing or for any purpose other than the transfer herein authorized.

For all other purposes, the effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
