## FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Whereas, in Decision No. 13332 (24 C.R.C. 677) in the above entitled matter, this Commission provided with reference to Schedule "A" therein established, that such rates, with the exception of the first block, would be subject to increase or decrease, upon approval of the Railroad Commission, on the basis of  $l_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$  cents per thousand subic feet for each 10 cent increase or decrease in the price paid for oil above or below the price of \$1.15 per barrel f. o. b. Stockton; and

Whereas, Western States Gas and Electric Company now makes affidavit that on February 1, 1925, the price paid for oil was increased by 25 cents per barrel to \$1.40 f. o. b. Stockton, which is 25 cents per barrel more than the basic price upon which rates were established in Decision No. 13332:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that Western States Gas and Electric Company be and it is hereby authorized to increase

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its rates designated as Schedule "A" effective for all meter readings taken on and after March 1, 1925, so that said rates shall be 4 cents per thousand cubic feet more than the basic rates set forth in said Decision No. 13332,

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that Western States Gas and Electric Company, in case it elects to exercise this privilege, file with the Commission on or before March 1, 1925, a revision of its Schedules as herein authorized.
