FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 14887 dated May 7, 1925, the Railroad Commission authorized L. N. Wood to sell his telephone system known as the Capay Valley Telephone System to Willard F. Smith. The Commission's order provides that the authority to sell such properties will not become effective until the Railroad Commission has authorized said Willard F. Smith to execute a mortgage to secure the payment of the \$600.00.one year six percent note mentioned in the Commission's decision.

Willard F. Smith has filed with the Commission a copy of the proposed mortgage. The mortgage is in satisfactory form and its execution should be authorized by the Commission; therefore.

IT IS HEREPY ORDERED that Willard F. Smith be, and he is hereby, authorized to execute a mortgage substantially in the same form as the mortgage filed in this proceeding, provided that the authority herein granted to execute a mortgage is for the purpose of this proceeding only, and is granted only in so far as this Commission has jurisdiction under the terms of the Public Utilities act and is not intended as an approval of said mortgage as to such other legal requirements to which said mortgage may be subject.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission's opinion and order in Decision No. 14887 be modified by substituting the name of Willard F. Smith for "Williard F. Smith" in each instance where said name "Williard F. Smith" occurs in said opinion and order.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the order in Decision No. 14887 dated May 7, 1925 shall remain in full force and effect, except as modified by this First Supplemental Order.
