O R D E R

Application having been filed with the Railroad Commission for an order authorizing R. D. Brown to sell his interest in Forest Hill Telephone Exchange and M. C. Langstaff to purchase the same for Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$350.00), and it appearing that this transfer will be in the interest of the public and, it appearing that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not required;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that R. D. Brown be, and he is hereby authorized to sell and transfer his interest in Forest Hill Telephone Exchange to M. C. Langstaff and that M. C. Langstaff be, and he is hereby authorized to purchase and acquire the same for Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$350.00); provided that this transfer shall have been made on or before August 31, 1925.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that M. C. Langstaff shall file a certified copy of the instrument of conveyance of this property with the Railroad Commission within thirty (30) days after the date of its execution.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that M. C. Langstaff shall file with the Railroad Commission within sixty (60) days after the date of the execution of said instrument of conveyance, a schedule of rates now legally in effect, together with rules and regulations governing telephone service in accordance with General Order No. 68.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the consideration for which the public utility properties are herein authorized to be transferred shall not be considered as a measure of the value of said properties for any purpose other than the transfer herein authorized.

For all other purposes, the effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
