ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order permitting the discontinuance and abandonment of its non-agency station at Serena on its Los Angeles Division in Santa Barbara County; for the abandonment and removal of the passenger shelter there maintained; and for the elimination of the station name from its records.

Applicant alleges that no passenger or freight business was transacted at this station during the year ending March 31, 1925; that although the station is designated as a flag stop for Trains No. 32 and 33 no passengers have used said stop for a number of years; that there is no indication of any traffic to be developed in the future which will require the maintenance of a passenger waiting shelter; and that the continued maintenance of the non-agency station is unnecessary for the public and the patrons of applicant.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that applicant, Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, be and it hereby is authorized to discontinue and abandon its non-agency station of Serena on its Los Angeles Division in Santa Barbara County; to abandon and

remove the passenger waiting shelter now maintained at such station; and to eliminate the name of Serena from its station records.
