O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order authorizing the abandonment of its station of Hislop on its Stockton Division in San Joaquin County, State of California.

Applicant alleges that the station of Hislop is located in the yard limits of Stockton; that the station was established many years ago to serve the plant of the Stockton Fire and Enamel Brick Company; that there is no station building at Hislop; that all freight business for the industries in the vicinity of the station is handled at the Stockton agency; and that all freight destined to or forwarded from Hislop should be billed to or from Stockton.

Exhibits filed with the application show the volume of freight handled during the yearly period ending June 30, 1925, and that no passenger business was transacted at this station during the same period.

In view of the fact that this non-agency station is now located within the yard limits of Stockton station, at which point all freight business is transacted, there appears no necessity for the continued maintenance of Hislop station.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, be and the same hereby is authorized to abandon its non-agency station of Hislop on its Stockton Division in San Joaquin County, and to eliminate such station from its records.
