ORDER

WHEREAS, Mrs. Lola Barnickel, owner and manager of the Weaverville Telephone Exchange, having filed an application with this Commission, requesting authority to establish within the town of Weaverville public telephone stations as may be necessary and to file and place in effect a charge of five cents (5¢) for each local message made from each such public telephone station, and

WHEREAS, the rendering of public pay station service will be in the interest of the subscribers of Mrs. Lola Barnickel and to the public and it appearing that applicant's request is reasonable and that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Mrs. Lola Barnickel be and she is hereby authorized to establish within the town of Weaverville public telephone stations as may be necessary to render adequate service to the public, and to charge the rate of five

cents (5¢) for each local message made from such public telephone stations on and after December 1st, 1925,

Providing said rate be filed with this Commission on or before November 30, 1925.
