BY THE COLMISSION:

SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Whereas, in Decision No. 13332 (24 C.R.C. 677) in the above entitled matter, this Commission provided, with reference to Schedule "A" therein established, that such rates, with the exception of the first block, would be subject to increase or decrease, upon approval of the Railroad Commission, on the basis of one and one-half (1½) cents per thousand cubic feet for each ten (10) cent increase or decrease in the price paid for oil above or below the price of \$1.15 per barrel f.o.b. Stockton; and,

Whereas, Western States Gas and Electric Company now makes affidavit that on October 27, 1925, the price paid for oil was decreased by twenty-one (21) cents per barrel from \$1.40 per barrel to \$1.19 per barrel, f.o.b. Stockton, which is four (4) cents per barrel more than the basic price upon which rates were established in Decision No. 13332;

IT IS HERREY ORDERED, that Western States Gas and Electric Company reduce its present rates designated as Schedule "A", effective for all meter readings taken on and after November 26, 1925, so that said rates shall be one (1) cent per thousand cubic feet more

than the basic rate established in Decision No. 13332.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that Western States Gas and Electric Company file with the Commission on or before November 20, 1925, a revision of its schedules as herein authorized.
