O P I N I O N

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, in the above entitled proceeding, requests this Commission for an order granting it a certificate that public convenience and necessity require the exercise by it of the rights and privileges conferred upon it under the franchise granted it by the Board of Trustees of the City of Chula Vista by Ordinance Number 128 on July 22, 1925. A copy of said franchise is set forth in this application. A hearing was held in this matter in San Francisco on December 28, 1925.

Applicant is now, and for a long time has been engaged in a general telephone and telegraph business in the City of Chula Vista and it appears that public convenience and necessity will be served by the granting of applicant's request.

O R D E R

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company having requested this Commission for an order granting it a certificate that public convenience and necessity require the exercise by it of the rights and privileges conferred upon it under a certain franchise granted it by the Board of Trustees of the City of Chula Vista; a copy of said franchise having been filed with the Railroad Commission; a public hearing having been held upon the above entitled proceeding, the matter being submitted and now ready for decision,

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the exercise of the rights and privileges contained in the said franchise, and

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity be, and the same is, hereby granted to The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company authorizing the exercise by it of the rights and privileges conferred upon it by Ordinance Number 128, dated July 22, 1925, by the Board of Trustees of the City of Chula Vista, providing The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company file a stipulation in a form satisfactory to this Commission on or before January 15, 1926, that it, its successors or assigns, will never claim before the Railroad Commission or before any court or other public body any value for the aforesaid

franchise in excess of the sum of \$150.00, the amount claimed to have been paid by it for said franchise.

For all other purposes, the effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
