FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPDER

Asron Buchheim, doing business under the fictitious name and style of the Buchheim Water Company, applied to this Commission for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate a public utility water system in the district known as Capistrano Beach, comprising the Townsite of San Juan-by-the-Sea, and a considerable area adjacent thereto in Orange County. The certificate was granted by order of the Commission in Decision No. 15186, dated July 16, 1925. On the thirteenth day of October, 1925, a petition was filed with the Commission stating that service had not been extended to any of the territory suthorized other than that served in the past, namely, Blocks 41 to and including 54 of the Townsite of Sen Juan-by-the-Sea, and that under existing circumstances it is inadvisable to extend service throughout the area as authorized in said Decision No. (15186. The Commission therefore is requested to modify its said order, limiting the area to be served by petitioner to that territory which he has served in the past, Blocks 41 to and including 54 as above.

The Commission has considered the request of applicant and believes that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not

necessary and that the request should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDEPED that the order in this Commission's Decision No. 15186 be and it is hereby modified to authorize the construction and operation of a water system in Blocks 41 to 54 inclusive of the Townsite of San Juan-by-the-Sea, said suthority to become effective only upon the securing by Laron Buchheim of the proper consent, frenchise or permit from the County of Orange covering the construction and operation of a water system in said Blocks 41 to 54 inclusive and as otherwise ordered in said Decision No. 15186.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the order in Decision No. 15186, dated July 16, 1925, shall remain in full force and effect except as modified herein by this First Supplemental Order.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
