BY THE COMMISSION -

OPINION and ORDER

H. C. Venable has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation of an automobile service for the transportation of milk to creameries in Glendale from points in the Artesia district, shown in tariffs now on file with the Railroad Commission under the name of Los Angeles, Downey and Norwalk Transfer, H. C. Venable, owner.

Applicant proposes to charge rates, to give service and use equipment in accordance with Exhibits A, B and C, which exhibits are attached to the application herein and made a part thereof.

Granting of the instant application will, in effect, authorize applicant Venable to extend his existing service to Glendale, his present delivery terminal being Los Angeles. That public convenience and necessity require the extension is indicated by a letter to the Commission from a creamery company at Glendale requesting favorable action on the Venable application, the request being based on a statement that because of a milk shortage in the San Fernando Valley it has been found necessary to seek an ad ditional supply in the Artesia District.

F. W. Reed, who transports milk, under authority of the Railroad Commission. to Glendale, has advised the Commission in writing that he has no objection to the granting of the Venable application.

In view of these circumstances we are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by E. C. Venable of an automobile service for the transportation of milk only between Los Angeles and Glendale, and

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity for such a service be, and the same hereby is granted to E. C. Venable, subject to the following conditions:

1- That the operating right herein granted shall not be considered as other than an extension of the operating right now owned by H. C. Venable and under which he is transporting milk between the points shown in the tariffs on file with the Railroad Commission under the name of Los Angeles, Downey and Norwalk Transfer, H.C.Venable, owner.

2- Applicant shall file his written acceptance of the certificate herein granted within a period of not to exceed ten (10) days from the date hereof.

3- Applicant shall file, in duplicate, within a period of not to exceed twenty (20) days from the date hereof, tariff of rates and time schedules which shall be identical with those attached to the application herein, said tariffs and time schedules to be prepared in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Railroad Commission as laid down in its General Order No.51.

4- The rights and privileges herein authorized may not be discontinued, sold, leased, transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such discontinuance, sale, lease, transfer or assignment has first been secured.

5- No vehicle may be operated by applicant herein unless such vehicle is owned by said applicant or is lessed by him under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.

5- For all other purposes the effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
