SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, having made appli-
cation for permission to construct a spur track at grade across Mon-
roe Avenue and across Franklin Street in the Town of Redwood City,
County of San Mateo, State of California; the Commission having made
its Decision No. 14559, dated February 11th, 1925, granting said ap-
plication; said Southern Pacific Company having made written applica-
tion that Decision No. 14559 be rescinded and that Application No.
10823 be dismissed, insofar as the proceeding pertains to the crossing
of Monroe Avenue, and it appearing that the Board of Trustees of the
Town of Redwood City has, by Resolution, dated November 16th, 1925,
legally closed to public use and travel that portion of Monroe Avenue
over which permission to cross with a spur track was granted, in Deci-
sion No. 14599, it appears to the Commission that Decision No. 14559
should be rescinded and the application dismissed, insofar as they per-
tain to the crossing of Monroe Avenue, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 14559 in the above-
entitled matter, insofar as it pertains to the crossing of Monroe Ave-
nue in the Town of Redwood City, County of San Mateo, be and it is

hereby rescinded.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the above-entitled application, insofar as it pertains to the crossing of said Monroe Avenue, be and it is hereby dismissed.

In all other respects the Commission's Decision No. 14559, dated February 11th, 1925, shall remain in full force and effect.
