FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

ORIGINAL

WHEREAS, N. P. Sinnott, who has been operating an automobile service for the transportation of passengers, freight, baggage and express between the town of Felton and Felton station, said service having been established under authority of the Railroad Commission as shown in the Commission's Decision No. 8265, dated October 25, 1920, and issued on Application No. 6209, has advised the Commission, in writing, under date of February 27, 1926, that having lost the contract to transport U. S. mail between the town of Felton and Felton Station, operation of the service authorized by the Railroad Commission cannot be conducted without monetary loss, and

WHEREAS, said N. P. Sinnott has petitioned the Railroad Commission for authority to discontinue said service and for an order cancelling said operating right,

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that N.P. Sinnott be, and the same hereby is authorized to discontinue automobile service between the town of Felton and Felton station, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to N. P. Sinnott in Decision No.8265 be, and the same hereby is revoked and annulled.
