BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF

In the Matter of the Application of POMONA VALLEY TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH UNION, ONTARIO AND UPLAND TELEPHONE COMPANY, and THE PACIFIC TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY for suthorization to discontinue so-called free service now being rendered between the exchange systems of Pomona Valley Telephone and Telegraph Union and Ontario and Upland Tolophone Company, and to make effective in lieu thereof standard interchange rates as now on file with the Commission for the service involved.

BY THE COMMISSION:

OBINION

On February 11, 1926, this Commission issued its Decision No. 15984 in the above entitled matter ordering the Pomone Valley Telephone and Telegraph Union and the Ontario and Upland Telephone Company to discontinue on and after March 1, 1926 the furnishing of the so-called free toll service between Chino and Ontario and Chino and Upland and that on and after March 1, 1926 The

Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company shall furnish toll service between Chino and Ontario and between Chino and Upland and charge and collect the initial rate of five cents (5ϕ) per message.

On February 27, 1925, the Commission received a petition from the City of Ontario, Chamber of Commerce of Ontario and others requesting a rehearing of this Commission's Decision above referred to. This Commission then issued its Order setting aside the Order in Decision No. 15984 and re-opened the proceeding for the purpose of receiving further testimony.

The rehearing in this matter was then held before Examiner Williams in the City of Pomona, on March 15, 1926, at which time and place the matter was submitted.

It is the contention of the City, and the Chamber of Commerce of Ontario that the establishment of the five cent $(5\not\epsilon)$ toll rate between Ontario and Chino would place Ontario in an unfavorable position relative to Chino as compared with Pomona and that the telephone service between Ontario and Chino should be furnished upon the same basis as telephone service between Pomona and Chino.

number of questions regarding the telephone service to the various communities served by the utilities involved in this proceeding that should be investigated before the discontinuance of the so-called free service existing between Chino and Ontario and for this reason we are of the opinion that the Order in Decision No. 15984 should be set aside and that applicants' request for the discontinuance of this service should be denied.

ORDER

The Railroad Commission on February 27, 1926, having issued its Supplemental Order setting aside the Order as contain-

ed in Decision No. 15984, dated February 11, 1926, in the above entitled proceeding and having re-opened this proceeding for the purpose of receiving further testimony, a public rehearing having been held and the matter having been submitted and now ready for decision:

The Railroad Commission of the State of California hereby finds as a fact that the Order in this Commission's Decision No. 15984 in Application No. 11480, dated February 11, 1926, should be vacated and set aside, and that application of the Pomona Valley Telephone and Telegraph Union, the Ontario and Upland Telephone Company and The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company requesting the discontinuance of the so-called free toll service between Chino and Ontario Exchanges should be denied.

Basing its Order on the foregoing findings of fect and upon such other findings of fact as are set forth in the Opinion preceding this Order.

IT IS HERERY ORDERED that the Order of the Railroad Commission in its Decision No. 15984 in Application No. 11480, dated February 11, 1926, be and it is hereby vacated and set aside.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the application of the Pomona Valley Telephone and Telegraph Union, the Ontario and Upland Telephone Companyand The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, requesting authority to discontinue the so-called free toll service between Chino and Ontario Exchanges be and the same is hereby denied.
