ORDER OF DISMISSAL

J. L. DeClusin and Charles L. Judson have petitioned the Railroad Commission of the State of California for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by them of an automobile service for the transportation of freight in what they describe as Stockton territory and Manteca territory.

A public hearing was conducted by Examiner Satterwhite at Sacramento on January 20, 1926 at which time the matter was adjourned to a date to be later fixed. Subsequently, in writing, under date of March 19, 1926, J. M. Inman and P. G. West,

attorneys for the applicants, requested that the matter be dismissed without prejudice.
