ORDER OF DISMISSAL

A. G. Fledderman, doing business under the name of Fledderman Brothers, has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile truck service for the transportation of freight, on call and under special contracts with the shippers, between all points in Siskiyou, Trinity and Shasta Counties. Originally applicant sought to serve Modoc, Tehama and Lassen Counties as well, but the application was amended at the hearing so as to exclude this territory.

Public hearings were held before Examiner Austin at Yreka on August 19th and September 14, 1925, and the matter was submitted. Under date of March 25, 1926, James M. Allen, Attorney for applicant, in writing, and in response to the Commission's circular letter dated March 22, 1926, advising that the application herein would be dismissed without prejudice unless within thirty (30) days from the date thereof it was amended by the substitution

of a service between fixed termini or over a regular route or routes, thus bringing the application within the purview of the Auto Stage and Truck Transportation Act and the jurisdiction of the Commission, advised that the application would not be amended.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and the same hereby is dismissed without prejudice.
