### OPINION

In the above entitled application, Consolidated Water and Development Company, a corporation, requests a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate a public utility water system in Tract No. 993, in Los Angeles County. The Commission is further asked to establish the same schedule of rates as are now in effect on the applicant's North Moneta water plant, which serves a territory immediately adjacent to above Tract No. 993.

A public hearing in this matter was held in Los Angeles before Examiner Williams after all interested parties had been duly notified and given an opportunity to be present and be heard.

Tract 993 was subdivided and placed upon the market by Albert H. Beach, who installed pipe lines throughout a consider-soll portion of the property for the purpose of supplying water to the purchasers of the lots. There are located upon the tract two wells and a pump-house site which under the terms of an agreement entered into by and between said Beach and applicant are all

supplying water to the tract for domestic and other purposes. The above mentioned agreement also provides for the installation by said Beach of all such additional mains or pipe lines as may be necessary to distribute water to all lots within the tract if and when applicant obtains the necessary authority from this Commission to so operate and actually undertakes such service.

The testimony indicates that one of the wells located upon Tract 993 may reasonably be expected to yield a considerably larger volume of water than will be required for use within the tract. It is intended to use the surplus water from this well to augment the water supply of the North Moneta plant, which is now in need of additional water.

dences constructed within its boundaries. There is no other water system available to furnish water to this property than the above mentioned North Moneta plant, owned and operated by applicant. In view of the fact that the franchise granted to the Consolidated Water and Development Company under Ordinance No. 1234 of the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County includes within its boundaries Tract No. 993, it appears that the request of applicant should be granted. The rates which are now in effect in the adjacent territory served by the North Moneta plant will be sutherized for water furnished to consumers in Tract No. 993.

The Consolidated Water and Development Company, a corporation, having made application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to supply water to consumers residing in
Tract 993 in Los Angeles County, a public hearing having been

held thereon, the matter having been submitted and the Commission being now fully informed therein,

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require and will require that the Consolidated Water and Development Company, a corporation, operate a water system for the purpose of furnishing water for domestic and other purposes to consumers located in Tract No. 993, Los Angeles County; and

IT IS HERREY ORDERED that the Consolidated Water and Development Company be and it is hereby directed to file with this Commission within twenty (20) days from the date of this order, the following schedule of rates, effective for all water delivered to consumers subsequent to the date of the order herein.
