

Decision No. 16496

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the matter of application of Southern Pacific Company for an order authorizing the construction at grade of a spur track across a portion of "R" Street, in the City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento, State of California.

Application No. 12489.

BY THE COMMISSION:

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Good Cause Appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Condition (2) of this Commission's Decision No. 15990, dated February 15th, 1926, in the above entitled matter and reading as follows:

(2) Said crossing shall be constructed equal or superior to type shown as Standard No. 3, in General Order No. 72 of this Commission and shall be constructed of a width to conform to that portion of said "R" Street now graded, with the tops of rails flush with the roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding one (1) per cent; shall be protected by a suitable crossing sign, and shall in every way be made safe for the passage thereover of vehicles and other road traffic;

be and it is hereby amended to read as follows:

(2) Said crossing shall be constructed equal or superior to type shown as Standard No. 2 (b) in General Order No. 72 of this Commission, said No. 2 (b) type of crossing to be maintained until such time as the City of Sacramento shall improve said "R" Street, at which time a crossing equal or superior to type shown as Standard No. 3 in General Order No. 72 of this Commission shall be installed by applicant, Southern Pacific Company. Said crossings shall be installed of a width to conform to that portion of "R" Street now graded or as hereafter improved, with tops of rails flush with the roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding one (1) per cent; shall be protected by a suitable crossing sign, and shall in every way be made safe for the passage thereover of vehicles and other road traffic.

In all other respects this Commission's order heretofore entered in the above entitled proceeding shall remain in full force and effect.
