ORDER OF DISMISSAL

In this proceeding the Railroad Commission is petitioned
for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity

Public hearings were conducted by Examiner Austin at
Stockton on September 15, 16, 17 and 18, 1925, and the matter
was submitted. Under date of April 2, 1926, in writing,
