ORDER OF DISMISSAL

In this proceeding the Railroad Commission is petitioned for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation of an automobile trucking service in territory principally located in the Counties of San Joaquin, Stanislaus and Merced.

Public hearings were conducted by Examiner Austin at Stockton on September 15, 16, 17 and 18, 1925, and the matter was submitted. Under date of April 2, 1926, in writing, Attorney Lafayette Smallpage requested that an Order of Dismissal without prejudice be entered in the matter.
